We were also joined by a Drama and Dance student from Northampton university who choreographed our dances and by a group of student from the Prince William school who were working towards their Bronze Award for the Duke of Edinburgh scheme. They were a pleasure to work with and a credit to their school. We have just completed our registration for our next production and now have 78 Dreamers!!

Our next production is 'What's new pussy-cat' and will be hosted at Thrapston Primary school on the 1st and 2nd of July. We are still able to ensure that this is a free to all group so that any young person can be part of our amazing team at no cost. 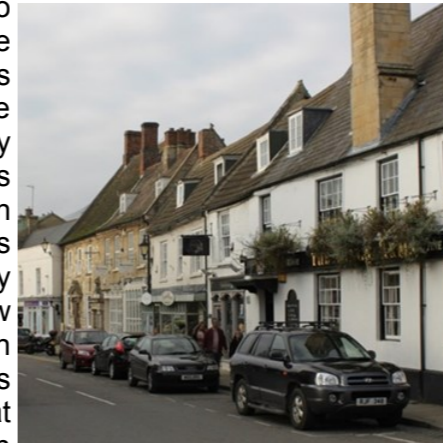

Town Centre Parking

Everyone who visits Thrapston town centre will be well aware of its parking problems. Thrapston has tripled in size over recent decades, but parking provision has not kept pace with this growth. It had been hoped to provide more parking spaces on available land off Cosy Nook, but this has now been sold for offices and at best may provide a few extra spaces in the evenings and at weekends with the owner's agreement. A Sainsbury's supermarket on the Cattle Market site now seems unlikely. Although this had its strong objectors, it would have provided a large number of new parking spaces close to the town centre, which would have been available for both supermarket customers and town centre visitors.



In view of this situation, representatives of the Town Council, at their request, recently met with representatives of East Northamptonshire Council and the County Council to discuss how town centre parking could be improved in Thrapston. As a result of this meeting, the Town Council hope to engage a consultant to advise it on how improvements could be made, such as by identifying where more car parking might be achieved and how the existing car parking could be better managed.

A major disappointment for us as a Town Council is the increase in the amount of litter, dog fouling and vandalism to facilities around the town. The MUGA at the Sports field and the Skate Park are particular problem areas for litter. The car park at the Sports Club is currently being used for the emptying of car ashtrays and smashing of glass by a small group of individuals parking here in the evenings and at weekends. Rainbow playgroup staff, Sports Association Committee members and Council staff have to constantly pick up behind these inconsiderate people. The recycled plastic picnic bench at the Skate Park was burnt to the ground recently by use of an accelerant and obscene graffiti has had to be removed at a cost. This don't care attitude and total lack of respect adopted by this small group of mindless individuals should be reported to the Police or Town Council. Please help us to protect our town.
